


- When any abnormality/failure occurs, stop using the product immediately and disconnect the power plug. (Risk of smoke/fire/electric shock)

  - The clothes are thrown off the Spin Tub and become trapped in the Outer Tub.



 Do not place any lighted candle or any light source (light, lighted cigarette, etc.) on top, inside or near the unit. (These light sources are fire hazards.)



 Do not allow water to come in contact with all electrical parts. (You may risk electrical shock)





- Do not use hot water over 50°C. (Plastic parts might be deformed.)
  - Do not allow the cord to be pinched by the unit or by heavy objects.
  - Do not expose the unit directly to sunlight to prevent fading of color and deformation of plastic parts.
  - Do not open the inner lid until the Spin Tub has come to a complete stop, your finger might get caught by the rotating Spin Tub.



- Do not use the Spinner without the Spinner Cap to avoid throwing out of clothes.
- Do not attempt to repair or reconstruct the unit in case of trouble. (Refer to the "Before calling for Service" of this manual or contact Panasonic Customer Care Center for assistance.)



- Do not exert or apply too much force on the Wash Timer.
- Do not pull the plug with wet hands.
- Do not pull the plug by pulling the cord.

#### Installation

## **A CAUTION**

- Plug your washing machine to an outlet of 230 V 60 Hz power source.
- · Do not place on carpets or rugs.

- Do not install on a weak or rough floor.
- Do not place unit on direct sunlight, humid area like bathroom and places exposed to rain.
- Do not place unit near open flame.




- Place the unit on a level floor and a well-ventilated area.
- Please remove all packaging materials before using the washing machine.


#### **USING A DRAIN HOSE**

The hose can be routed to the left or right side of the body, depending on the location of your house's drain hole.


To do so, perform the following:

- 1 The default position of the Hose is at the right side of the body (with person facing in front of the unit): To set the Hose at the left side, (Fig. 1)
  - a Reroute the Hose to the left side. (Fig 2)
  - **b** Hook the Hose to the Hose Hanger to your left side.
  - Hose arrangement. (fig. 3)
    - a Do not put hose tip under the water.
    - **b** Always lay down drain hose flat on the ground.
    - The extension drain hose length should be 2m or less.





Note: After unpacking the unit and laying down the Hose, some water used in quality assurance testing may come out of the Hose.







Turn Wash Timer to halfway before












#### **INITIAL SPINNING**















#### **SPIN RINSING**

With Spin Rinsing, the soap suds in the clothes will be removed faster and you can save on rinsing time and water. However, if the water from the faucet contain rust and/or other foreign matter, do not perform spin rinsing.



- Remove the Spinner Cap then insert the water supply hose to the Spin Rinse Inlet. Keep the water hose from blocking the control panel.
- While the Spin Timer is at "OFF" position, turn on faucet for 1 minute. Adjust the water flow so that the water is directed approximately to the center of the Spin Tub.
- Turn off faucet then return Spinner Cap properly and spin for about 1-2 minutes.

Note: Spinning Operation will not start when the Spinner Lid is open even when the Spin Timer is set.

- Spin operation will stop once the Spinner Lid is opened.

#### Notes:

#### If noisy vibration occurs:


- a. Turn off the Spin Timer and open the Spinner Lid and Inner Lid.
- b. Rearrange the load, then proceed with spinning or follow step 2-3 of initial spinning.



#### If clothes are thrown out of the Spin Tub and become trapped in the Outer Tub:


numbers). To avoid this problem, use the Spinner Cap and mount it securely.



## RINSING



CYCLE SELECTOR







#### Ordinary Rinsing

- a. Perform steps 1 to 3 of Rinsing.
- b. Set Wash Timer to 3-5 minutes.
- c. After the Wash Timer returns to "OFF", set Cycle Selector to Drain.
- Always close the Wash Lid to avoid splashing of water.

#### Overflow Rinsing

- a. Perform steps 1 to 3 of Rinsing.
- b. Set Wash Timer to 5-7 minutes.
- c. Turn on faucet to supply water continuously into the Wash Tub, while Wash Timer is "ON".
- d. After Wash Timer has turned to "OFF", turn off the faucet.



## **⚠** CAUTION

To minimize leak during overflow rinsing and washing:



Set water flow to minimum during overflow rinsing.




To avoid disruption during Spinning cycle:



Do not place heavy objects on the Spinner Lid.



To avoid damage to Spin motor, do not spin for more than 10 min continuously.


## Cleaning Guide



Always unplug the unit before performing cleaning maintenance.

#### When Cleaning External Surfaces





- Do not splash water on the control panel.
- Do not use brushes, petroleum-based chemicals, polishing powders, rubbing
- compound, cleansers, thinner, benzene, alcohol and other hazardous chemicals.
- Use soft, dry cloth.
- For very dirty surfaces, use only soft cloth dipped in mild soap and water solution.

#### To Clean Overflow Filter



- Pinch both side of the Overflow Filter then pull.
- 2 Remove Lint Filter (Refer how To Clean Lint Filter to remove) and splash with water.
- Remount the Overflow Filter after re-attaching the Lint Filter (Be sure that the bottom hook is secured to the tub.)

#### To Clean Lint Filter Unit

- 1 Remove Lint Filter Unit by pushing the top tab downwards then pull it outside from the Overflow Filter.
- 2 Turn Lint Filter Net inside out, remove lint and wash with water.
- 3 Insert the bottom portion of the Lint Filter on the Overflow Filter then push it forward until it clicks

#### To Clean the Pulsator

- 1 Use a screwdriver to loosen the screw. (Do not loosen all the way.)
- 2 Lift the Pulsator by pulling the screw.
- 3 Remove lint and splash with water. Wipe the Pulsator with dry cloth.
- 6 Remount the Pulsator then tighten the screw properly.
- When turning the screw, be sure not to damage the screw head.
