



How to replace the fuse


The location of the fuse differ according to the type of AC mains plug (figures A and B). Confirm the AC mains plug fitted and follow the instructions below.


Note:

Use the AC mains lead that is suitable for your household mains socket

Transporting the unit

Preparation

Disconnect all connected devices and cables from the unit.



Note:

- More than one person is required to move, tilt or carry the unit
- Keep the unit at least 10 mm away from other objects for proper ventilation.
- Put the unit on a flat safe surface.
- The speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not put them near PCs or other equipment easily influenced by magnetism.
- The audio output is multidirectional. Do not obstruct the speakers with any object that may decrease the sound quality.
- The subwoofer is located at the front and rear of the unit. Keep the rear of the unit at least 10 cm away from the wall for better sound quality.



- When you play at high levels for a long period, it can cause damage to the speakers and decrease the life of the speakers.
- Decrease the volume in these conditions to prevent damage:
 - When the sound is distorted.
 - When you adjust the sound quality.

CAUTION!

- Improper handling or transportation manner may cause the unit to fall, etc., resulting in damage and/or personal injury.
- Do not transport the unit by holding the lighting plate as this may damage the lighting plate.
- · Do not put any object on the top panel of the unit.
- Do not allow children to climb on the unit.




Maintenance

Disconnect the AC mains lead before maintenance. Clean this system with a soft, dry cloth.

- Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzine to clean this system.
- Before using chemically treated cloth, read the instructions that came with the cloth carefully.

Preparing the remote control




Use alkaline or manganese battery.

Install the battery so that the poles (+ and –) align with those in the remote control.


Making the connections

Connect the AC mains lead only after all the other connections have been made.



1 Connect the FM indoor antenna.

Put the antenna where reception is best.



2 Connect the AC mains lead.

Do not use any other AC mains leads except the supplied one.

Hold the unit when connecting or disconnecting the AC mains lead to prevent the unit from falling.



To household mains socket

Conserving power

The system consumes a small amount of power even when it is in standby mode. Disconnect the power supply if you do not use the system.


Some settings will be lost after you disconnect the system. You have to set them again.

Note:

Keep the antennas away from the AC mains lead to avoid picking up noise.

Overview of controls

Do the procedures with the remote control. You can also use the touch keys on the unit if they are the same.



1 Standby/on switch [U], [U/I]

Press*1 or touch*2 to switch the unit from on to standby mode or vice versa. In standby mode, the unit is still consuming a small amount of power.

- *1 For the button on the remote control
- *2 For the touch key on the unit



Note:

You can use the touch keys just by touching the marks. The system beeps when you touch any touch key. Refer to "Touch sound" (\Rightarrow 18) on how to switch off the touch sound.

- To ensure these touch keys are operated correctly, make sure to touch within the touching area of the mark (refer to the illustration above for the touch area).
- To avoid operating these touch keys unintentionally, do not put any object on them.

Preparing media

Disc

- 1 Touch [▲] on the unit to open the disc tray. Put in a disc with the label facing up. Touch again to close the disc tray.
- Press [SELECT <, >] repeatedly to select "CD".

USB

Preparation

Before you connect a USB device to the system, make sure you do a backup of the data.

- Decrease the volume and connect the USB device to the USB port.
- Press [SELECT <, >] repeatedly to select "USB A" or "USB B".

USB status indicator lights up in red when selected.

Note:

- Do not use a USB extension cable. The system cannot recognise USB device connected through a cable.
- Some devices cannot be charged as the maximum USB charging current is 0.5 A only.

Bluetooth®

You can connect and play an audio device wirelessly through Bluetooth®.

Preparation

- · Switch on the unit.
- Switch on the Bluetooth® feature of the device and put the device near the system.
- Read the operating instructions of the device for details.

Pairing a device

Preparation

If this system is connected to a Bluetooth® device, disconnect it (⇒ 8).

- 1 Press [**8**].
 - If "PAIRING" is shown, continue with step 3.
- Press [PLAY MENU] to select "PAIRING" and then press [OK].
- 3 Select "SC-UA90" from the Bluetooth® menu of the device.

If prompted for a passkey, input "0000" or "1234". The device connects with this system automatically after pairing is complete.

The MAC address (example: 6C:5A:B5:B3:1D:0F) may be shown before "SC-UA90" is shown.

The name of the connected device is shown for a few seconds.

Using the unit

- 1 Touch and hold [🚱] until "PAIRING" is shown.
- 2 Select "SC-UA90" from the Bluetooth® menu of the device.

Note:

- You can pair up to 8 devices with this system. If a 9th device is paired, the device that has not been used for the longest time will be replaced.
- Depending on the searching functionality of the Bluetooth® device and the surrounding environment, if the product name is not shown on the Bluetooth® menu of the device, switch off and then switch on the Bluetooth® feature of the device repeatedly during the pairing process.

Connecting a device

Preparation

If this system is connected to a Bluetooth® device, disconnect it (⇒ 8).

- Press [].
 "BLUETOOTH READY" is shown.
- 2 Select "SC-UA90" from the Bluetooth® menu of the device.

The name of the connected device is shown for a few seconds

3 Start playback on the device.

Note:

- · A device must be paired to connect.
- · This system can only connect to one device at a time.
- When "BLUETOOTH" is selected as the source, this system will automatically try to connect to the last connected device. ("LINKING" is shown during this process.)

Disconnecting a device

While a Bluetooth® device is connected

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "DISCONNECT?".
- 2 Press [◄, ►] to select "OK? YES" and then press [OK].

"BLUETOOTH READY" is shown. To cancel, select "OK? NO".

Using the unit

Touch and hold [] until "PAIRING" is shown.

Note:

A device is disconnected when you:

- · Select a different source.
- · Move the device out of the maximum range.
- · Disable the Bluetooth® transmission of the device.
- · Switch off the system or the device.

Media playback

The following marks indicate the availability of the feature.

CD : USB : CD-R/RW in CD-DA format or with MP3 files. USB device with MP3 files.

MEMORY :

BLUETOOTH: Bluetooth® device.

Basic playback

CD USB BLUETOOTH MEMORY

Play	Press [►/II].
Stop	Press [II]. USB MEMORY The position is memorised. "RESUME" is shown. Press again to stop fully.
Pause	Press [►/II]. Press again to continue playback.
Skip	Press [I◀◀/◀◀] or [▶▶/▶▶I] to skip track. CD USB MEMORY

	Press [▲, ▼] to skip MP3 album.
Search	Press and hold [I◄◄/◄◄] or [▶▶/▶▶I].

Note:

Depending on the Bluetooth® device, some operations may not work.


Viewing available information

CD USB BLUETOOTH MEMORY

You can view the available information, such as MP3 album and track number, on the display panel.

Press [DISPLAY] repeatedly.

Example: MP3 album and track number display.



Note:

- · Maximum characters that can be shown: Approximately 32
- This system supports ver. 1.0, 1.1 and 2.3 ID3 tags.
- Text data that the system does not support can show differently.

Play menu

CD USB MEMORY

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU].
- 2 Press [◄, ▶] to select the setting and then press [OK].

OFF PLAYMODE	Cancel the setting.
1-TRACK	Play one selected track. Press the numeric buttons to select the track.
1-ALBUM 1 L	Play one selected MP3 album. Press [▲, ▼] to select the MP3 album.
RANDOM RND	Play all tracks randomly.
1-ALBUM RANDOM 1 a RND	Play all tracks in one selected MP3 album randomly. Press [▲, ▼] to select the MP3 album.
ALL REPEAT	Repeat all tracks.
1-TRACK REPEAT 1 ♣ ⇔	Repeat 1-TRACK.
1-ALBUM REPEAT 1 to ○	Repeat 1-ALBUM.
RANDOM REPEAT	Repeat random playback.
1-ALBUM RANDOM REPEAT 1	Repeat 1-ALBUM RANDOM.

Note:

- During random playback, you cannot skip to tracks which have been played.
- The setting is cancelled when you open the disc tray or disconnect the USB device.

Link mode

BLUETOOTH

You can change the link mode to suit the connection type.

Preparation

If this system is connected to a Bluetooth® device, disconnect it (⇒ 8).

- Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "LINK MODE".
- 2 Press [◄, ►] to select the mode and then press [OK].

MODE 1	Emphasis on connectivity.
MODE 2 (default)	Emphasis on sound quality.

Note:

- When enjoying video contents with this function, the video and audio output may not be synchronised. In this case, select "MODE 1".
- · Select "MODE 1" if the sound is interrupted.

Note on disc

- This system can play CD-R/RW with CD-DA or MP3 format content.
- Before playback, finalise the disc on the device it was recorded on.
- Some CD-R/RW cannot be played because of the condition of the recording.

■ Note on USB device

- This system does not guarantee connection with all USB devices.
- This system supports USB 2.0 full speed.
- This system can support USB devices of up to 32 GB.
- · Only FAT 12/16/32 file system is supported.

Note on MP3 file

- Files are defined as tracks and folders are defined as albums.
- Tracks must have the extension ".mp3" or ".MP3".
- Tracks will not necessarily be played in the order you recorded them.
- · Some files can fail to work because of the sector size.

MP3 file on disc

- · This system can access up to:
 - 255 albums (including root folder)
 - 999 tracks
 - 20 sessions
- Disc must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).

MP3 file on USB device

- · This system can access up to:
 - 800 albums (including root folder)
 - 8000 tracks
 - 999 tracks in one album

Radio

Preparation

Press [SELECT <, >] repeatedly to select "FM".

Manual tuning

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "TUNE MODE".
 - Or touch [■] on the unit to select "MANUAL". Continue with step 3.
- 2 Press [◄, ▶] to select "MANUAL" and then press [OK].
- 3 Press [I◄◄/◄◄] or [►►/►►I] to tune in to the station.

To tune automatically, press and hold the button until the frequency starts changing quickly.

"STEREO" is shown when a stereo broadcast is being received.

Memory presetting

You can preset up to 30 FM stations.

Automatic presetting

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] to select "A.PRESET".
- 2 Press [◀, ▶] to select "LOWEST" or "CURRENT" and then press [OK].

LOWEST	Tuning begins from the lowest frequency.
CURRENT	Tuning begins from the current frequency.

The tuner presets all the stations it can receive into the channels in ascending order.

To cancel, press [■].

Manual presetting

1 Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "TUNE MODE".

Or touch [■] on the unit to select "MANUAL". Continue with step 3.

- 2 Press [◄, ►] to select "MANUAL" and then press [OK].
- 3 Press [I◄◄/◄◄] or [►►/►►I] to tune in to the station.
- 4 Press [OK].
- 5 Press the numeric buttons to select a preset number.

Do steps 3 through 5 again to preset more stations. The new station replaces any station that occupies the same preset number.

Selecting a preset station

1 Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "TUNE MODE".

Or touch [■] on the unit to select "PRESET". Continue with step 3.

- 2 Press [◀, ▶] to select "PRESET" and then press [OK].
- 3 Press the numeric buttons, [I◄◄/◄◄] or [►►/►►] to select the preset station.

Improving the sound quality

- 1 Press [PLAY MENU] repeatedly to select "FM MODE".
- 2 Press [◄, ►] to select "MONO" and then press [OK].

To cancel, select "STEREO".

"MONO" is also cancelled when you change the frequency.

To memorise the setting

Continue with step 4 of "Manual presetting" (⇒ 10).

Checking the signal status

Press [DISPLAY].

FM	The FM signal is weak. The system is not tuned in to a station.
FM ST	The FM signal is in stereo.
FM MONO	"MONO" is selected as the "FM MODE". The FM signal is in monaural.

Recording

This system can record up to 800 folders (maximum 999 tracks in an album) or a total of 8000 tracks, depending on the available storage capacity of the internal memory or the USB device in USB 18.

To check storage space

In the stop mode, press [DISPLAY] repeatedly.

Example: Remaining recording time of the internal memory.



- source
 "UPDATE" is shown when the system is reading the
- USB device.
 "NO DEVICE" is shown if there is no USB device connected to USB B.

To select where recordings are kept

- 1 Press [SETUP] repeatedly to select "REC TO?".
- 2 Press [◀, ▶] to select "MEMORY" or "USB B" and then press [OK].

Note:

- · All recordings are in ".mp3" format.
- You cannot do recording when you are using random playback mode or in the optical input source.
- The DJ function or Karaoke function is switched off when you start recording.
- · Repeat playback mode is cancelled during recording.
- A new album is added each time you do a recording.
- The sequence of album may change after the recording.
 The recordings are kept in a folder named "REC_DATA" in the USB device or the internal memory.
- USB status indicator blinks in red during USB recording.
- Internal memory status indicator blinks in red during internal memory recording.

Basic recording

1 Select the source you want to record.

CD-DA

Prepare the disc playback mode.

Record all tracks	Select "OFF PLAYMODE" (⇒ 9).
Record a specified track	Select "1-TRACK" (⇒ 9).

Make sure the disc is stopped.

Radio

Tune in to the radio station.

AUX

Connect and play the equipment (⇒ 17).

2 Press [REC ●/II] to start recording.

The name of the folder that keeps the recording is shown

Stop recording	Press [■]. "WRITING" is shown.
Pause recording	Press [REC ●/II] during recording. Press again to continue recording.
	Note: You can pause during recording from the radio or AUX (except in "SYNCHRO" mode). A track mark is added every time you pause (⇔ 12).

Note:

- Wait for a few seconds for the system to prepare the USB device before you start recording.
- When the next track of the disc is being recorded, it will be shown on the display.

High-speed recording

CD-DA disc recording speed:

CD, CD-R: Three times (3x) the normal speed. CD-RW: Two times (2x) the normal speed.

- 1 Put in the disc you want to record.
- 2 Press [REC MODE] repeatedly to select "NORMAL" or "HI-SPEED" and then press [OK1.
- 3 Press [REC ●/II] to start recording.

Note:

- If you cannot record at high-speed because of the condition of the disc, record at normal speed.
- The sound is muted during high-speed recording.

Adding track marks

When recording from the radio or AUX, you can divide tracks using various modes.

Before recording

Press [REC MODE] to select the mode.

MANUAL	Add a track mark manually. Press [OK] during recording to add a track mark.
	Note: Recording is automatically divided in 60-minute per track.
SYNCHRO (For AUX source)	Recording starts automatically when the other equipment starts to play. Recording pauses when it detects silence for 3 seconds.
TIME MARK	A track is automatically divided at 5-minute intervals.

Note:

- During recording, if you press [OK] or pause recording while using "TIME MARK" mode, the 5-minute counter is reset.
- · You cannot add track marks manually in "SYNCHRO" mode.

Recording MP3 tracks

You can record MP3 tracks from:

- MP3 disc to USB B or the internal memory
- USB A to USB B or the internal memory
- USB B to the internal memory or vice versa
- Prepare the source you want to record.

Record all tracks	Select "OFF PLAYMODE" (⇒ 9).
Record a specified album or track	Select "1-ALBUM" or "1-TRACK" (⇒ 9).

Press [REC ●/II] to start recording.

To check the recording progress, press [DISPLAY].

Note:

- · Some tracks can use a longer time to record.
- Some tracks cannot be recorded because of the condition of the source.
- The recorded file name is the same as the original file (only a maximum of 32 characters can be shown on the display panel).

Deleting the recorded tracks

- 1 Press [SELECT <, >] repeatedly to select "MEMORY" or "USB B".
- 2 Press [▲, ▼] to select the album.
- 3 Press [I◄◄/◄◄] or [►►/►►I] to select the track.
- 4 Press [EDIT MODE] to select the mode.

TRACK DEL	Delete a single track.
ALBUM DEL	Delete one album (maximum 999 tracks).
FORMAT	Format the USB device.
ALL DEL	Delete all albums in the internal memory.

5 Press [OK].

The selected item to be deleted is shown.

6 Press [OK].

"SURE? NO" is shown.

7 Press [◄, ►] to select "SURE? YES" and then press [OK].

"WRITING" is shown.

To cancel, select "SURE? NO".

Sound effects

- 1 Press [SOUND] to select the sound effect.
- 2 Press [◀, ▶] to select the setting and then press [OK].

Illumination

You can switch on or switch off the illumination on the system.

Press [ILLUMINATION] to select "ON" and then press [OK].

To cancel, select "OFF".

DJ functions

You can use the DJ functions to add sound effects or sample sound between songs.

Using the "Panasonic MAX Juke" app

You can download and install the free app "Panasonic MAX Juke" on Google Play™ or App Store® for additional features, such as to request song playback from multiple devices simultaneously. The DJ function is switched off when you switch off the system, change to another source or start recording.

DJ jukebox

USB MEMORY

You can use the DJ jukebox function to add cross-fade effect or sample sound mix between songs.

- Press [JUKEBOX] to select "DJ JUKEBOX SELECT NUMBER" or "ON DJ JUKEBOX". To cancel, select "OFF JUKEBOX".
- Press [1] to [6] to select the effect and then press [OK].

[1]	Cross-fade: The current track volume gradually becomes soft, and the next track volume gradually becomes loud.
[2] to [6]	Sample sound mix: Sample sound is added to the intervals of all tracks.

To cancel, press the button again.

Using the unit

- Touch [JUKEBOX] to select "DJ JUKEBOX SELECT NUMBER" or "ON DJ JUKEBOX". To cancel, select "OFF JUKEBOX".
- 2 Touch [I◄◄/◄◄] or [►►/►►] to select the effect. To cancel, select "OFF EFFECT".

Note




