

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Chapter 1: Introduction

A Warning

Handling the mains plug and lead

Insert the mains plug fully into the socket outlet. (If the mains plug is loose, it could generate heat and cause fire.)

Ensure that the mains plug is easily accessible.


Do not touch the mains plug with a wet hand. (This may cause electrical shock.)

Do not use any mains lead other than that provided with this TV. (This may cause fire or electrical shock.)

Do not damage the mains lead. (A damaged lead may cause fire or electrical shock.)

- Do not move the TV with the lead plugged in the socket outlet.
- Do not place a heavy object on the lead or place the lead near a high-temperature object.
- . Do not twist the lead, bend it excessively or stretch it.
- Do not pull on the lead. Hold onto the mains plug body when disconnecting the lead.
- · Do not use a damaged mains plug or socket outlet.
- · Use the TV in moderate climates.

If you find any abnormality, remove the mains plug immediately!

Do not place the TV on sloped or unstable surfaces, and ensure that the TV does not hang over the edge of the base

Do not remove covers and never modify the TV by yourself

- Do not remove the rear cover as live parts are accessible when it is removed. There are no user serviceable parts inside. (High-voltage components may cause serious electrical shock.)
- Have the TV checked, adjusted, or repaired at your local Panasonic dealer.
- Please refer the information on exterior back enclosure for electrical and safety information before installing or operating the apparatus.
- The mains plug is used as disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

Use only the dedicated pedestals/ mounting equipments

- Use an unapproved pedestal or other fixtures may make the TV unstable, risking injury. Be sure to ask your local Panasonic dealer to perform setup.
- When mounting the TV on a wall or ceiling, be sure to install the product according to the method recommended by the manufacturer. This is a safety feature.
- Only use attachments/accessories specified or provided by the manufacturer (such as the exclusive supply adapter, battery, etc.).

Do not expose to rain or excessive moisture

 To prevent damage which might result in electrical shock or fire, do not expose this TV to rain or excessive moisture. This TV must not be exposed dripping or splashing water and objects filled with liquid, such as vases, must not be placed on top of or above the TV

Do not expose to direct sunlight and other sources of heat

 Avoid exposing the TV to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.



To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times.

Use Environment

warning: Never place a television set in an unstable location. A television set may fall, causing serious personal injury or death. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:

- Using cabinets or stands recommended by the manufacturer of the television.
- Only using furniture that can safely support the television.
- Ensuring the television is not overhanging the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Not placing the television on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the television set to a suitable support.
- Not placing the television set on cloth or other materials that may be located between the television set and supporting furniture.
- Educating children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the television or its controls.

If your existing television set is being retained and relocated, the same considerations as above should be applied.

Cleaning

Hanging the TV Set on the Wall

- Check that the wall can support the weight of the TV set and wall mount assembly.
- Follow the mounting instructions provided with the wall mount
- The TV set must be installed on a vertical wall.
- Make sure to use only screws suitable for the material of the wall.
- Make sure that the TV set cables are placed so that there is not danger of tripping over them.
 - All other safety instructions about our TV sets are also applicable here.

Warning: This operation requires two people.

To ensure a safe installation, observe the following safety.

 Read these instructions——All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.

- 2.Keep these instructions---These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
- **3. Read all warnings**---All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
- **4.Follow all instructions**—-All operating instructions must be followed.
- 5.Attachments---Only use attachments/ accessories specified by the manufacturer. Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer. Use of improper attachments can result in accidents.
- 6.Power source---This product is intended to be supplied by a listed power supply indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the cable system.

Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong is provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.

7.Power cord protection---Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.

Note: Where the mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

- **8.Overloading**---Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or convenience receptacles on other equipment as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- 9.Servicing---Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.
- 10.Damage requiring service---If any of the following conditions occurs, unplug the power cord from the AC outlet, and request a qualified service person to perform repairs.
 - a. When the power cord or plug is damaged.
- b.When a liquid is spilled on the product or when objects have fallen into the product.

c.When the product has been exposed to rain or water. d.When the product does not operate properly as described in the operating instructions.


Do not touch the controls other than those described in the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of controls not described in the instructions can cause damage, which often requires extensive adjustment work by a qualified technician.

- e.If the product has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged in any way.
- f.When the product displays an abnormal condition or exhibits a distinct change in performance. Any noticeable abnormality in the product indicates that the product needs servicing.
- 11.Replacement parts—In case the product needs replacement parts, make sure that the service person uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer, or those with the same characteristics and performance as the original parts. Use of unauthorized parts can result in fire, electric shock and/or other danger.
- 12.Safety checks---Upon completion of service or repair work, request the service technician to perform safety checks to ensure that the product is in proper operating condition.
- 13. Stand---Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. Do not place the product on an unstable trolley, stand, tripod or table. Placing the product on an unstable base can cause the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. - 14.Careful move---When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over. Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surfaces can cause the product to fall from the trolley.
 - Never attempt to move the TV unless the AC power cord has been disconnected.

- 15.Lightning---Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time. For added protection for this television equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the equipment due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 16.Panel protection---The display panel used in this product is made of glass. Therefore, it can break when the product is dropped or impacted upon by other objects. Be careful not to be injured by broken glass pieces in case the display panel breaks.
- 17.Pixel defect---The display panel is a very high technology product, giving you finely detailed pictures. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed point of blue, green or red. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.

18. Do not block the rear air vents

- Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent failure of electronic components.
- Ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items such as newspapers, table cloths and curtains.
- We recommended that a gap of at least 10 cm is left all around this TV even when placed inside a cabinet or between shelves.
- When using the pedestal, keep the space between the bottom of the TV and the surface where the TV is set.
- If pedestal is not used, ensure the vents is the bottom of the TV are not blocked.
- Do not install this equipment in a confined or building-in space such as a book case or similar unit, and remain a well ventilation conditions at open site.

19. Do not ingest the battery, Chemical Burn Hazard--

Symbol

- For the terminals marked with symbol of " **4**' may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute a risk of electric shock. The external wiring connected to the terminals requires installation by an instructed person or the used of ready-made leads or cords.
- If the product has the symbol in its rating label and the power cord has two pins, it means that the equipment is a Class II or double insulated electrical appliance. It has been designed in such a way that it does not require a safety connection to electrical earth.
- The following information are recommended to be included where applicable:
 - Refers to alternating current(AC).
 - Refers to direct current(DC).
 - Refers to ClassII equipment.
 - Refers to stand-by.
 - Refers to power ON.
 - Refers to dangerous voltage.

Installing/Removing Remote's Batteries

Place two AAA size batteries in the remote control's battery compartment, making sure to match the polarity markings inside the compartment.








Caution

- Replace only with same or equivalent type. Do not mix different battery types (such as alkaline and manganese batteries).

- 6) Do not burn or break up batteries.
- 7) Do not expose batteries to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- 8) Make sure you dispose of batteries correctly.
- 9) Ensure batteries are replaced correctly, there is danger of explosion and fire if battery is reversed.
- 10) Do not disassemble or modify the remote control.

Precautions for Using Remote Control

- Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor. The items between the remote control and the remote sensor will interfere the normal operation.
- Do not make remote control vibrate violently. Also, do not splash liquid on the remote control, also do not put the remote control in high humidity place.
- Do not place remote control under direct sunlight which will cause deformation of the unit by heat.
- When the remote sensor is under direct sunlight or strong lighting, the remote control will do not work.
 If so please change the lighting or TV's position, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor.



Incorrect fitting may cause equipment to fall, resulting in injury and product damage. Any damage resulting from not having a professional installer mount your unit will void your warranty.
- When any optional accessories or wall hanging brackets are used, always ensure that the instructions provided are followed fully.
- Do not mount the unit directly below ceiling lights (such as spotlights or halogen lights) which typically give off high heat. Doing so may warp or damage plastic cabinet parts.
- Take care when fixing wall brackets to the wall. Wall mounted equipment shall not be grounded by metal within the wall. Always ensure that there are no electrical cables or pipes in the wall before hanging bracket.
- To prevent fall and injury, remove the TV from its fixed wall position when it is no longer in use.

Pedestal Installation



Warning

Do not disassemble or modify the pedestal.

 Otherwise the TV may fall over and become damaged, and personal injury may result.



Caution

Do not use the pedestal if it becomes warped or physically damaged.

 If you use the pedestal while it is physically damaged, personal injury may result. Contact your local Panasonic dealer immediately.

During set-up, make sure that all screws are securely tightened.

 If insufficient care is taken to ensure screws are properly tightened during assembly, the pedestal will not be strong enough to support the TV, and it might fall over and become damaged, and personal injury may result.

Ensure that the TV does not fall over.

 If the TV is knocked or children climb onto the pedestal with the TV installed, the TV may fall over and personal injury may result.

Two or more people are required to install and remove the TV.

 If two or more people are not present, the TV may be dropped, and personal injury may result.

When removing the pedestal from the TV, do not remove the pedestal by the methods other than the specified procedure.

 Otherwise the TV and / or pedestal may fall over and become damaged, and personal injury may result.


Removing the pedestal from the TV

Be sure to remove the pedestal in the following way when using the wall-hanging bracket or repacking the TV.


- 1 Remove the assembly screws from the TV.



3. Connect the TV and base by putting and fastening matched screws into the holes.




Chapter 2: Basic Features

TV Controls

■ Turn on or turn off the TV

- Connect the power cord to the power outlet and the TV. Then the TV will be standby.
- 2. Press POWER button to turn on the TV.
- 3. In working status, press **POWER** button to turn the TV to standby mode.
- Disconnect the power cord to power off the TV completely.

■ Power Indicator





Push Left/Right:

Adjust sound volume.

Go to left/right to select the desired content in main menu. Switch to the selected source in source list.


Push Backward/Forward:

Network port.




2. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT

connect an optical cable to output the TV's digital audio signal to a compatible audio receiver.



3. HDMI IN

Receive HDMI input signal from the connected HDMI device.



Note:

1) If the external device has a DVI output only, use a DVI to HDMI adapter cable to connect to the HDMI terminal.
2) For the audio receiver control Sound Out, firstly you must have a device which supports HDMI Sound Out, then connect it to the HDMI1 port. When the "Sound Out" setting is enabled on your TV, the TV's speakers will mute automatically and the audio will be outputted on your sound device system.

4. USB

Connect USB devices to the TV.



5. ANTENNA IN

Connect a coaxial cable to receive signal from the antenna or cable.




Note:

- 1) Do not place the RF cable under the TV.
- To obtain the optimum quality of picture and sound, an aerial, the correct cable (75Ω coaxial) and the correct terminal are required.
- 3) If a community antenna system is used, you may require the correct connection cable and plug between the wall aerial socket and the TV.
- 4) Your local Television Service Center or dealer may be able to assist you in obtaining the correct aerial system for your particular area and the accessories required.
- Any matters regarding aerial installation, upgrading of existing systems or accessories required, and the costs incurred, are the responsibility of you, the customer.

Receive audio and video signal from signal source such as DVD.

Debugging port only for technicians.



- 5. VOL +/-: Increase or decrease the sound volume.
- 6. P ^/v: Change to next or previous program.
- 7. MUTE: Mute or restore the TV sound.
- 8. APPS (iii): Access Smart TV Apps directly.
- 9. NETFLIX: Access Netflix directly.
- **10. MENU:** Access main menu settings, or access the menu of quick settings in media player.

Chapter 2: Basic Features

Initial Setup

When you turn on the TV for the first time, there will show a wizard to guide you to finish the following initial settings:

Step 1: Start the initial setup.



Step 2: Select the menu language as you need.



Step 3: Select your TV using environment.



Step 4: Read "DATA COLLECTION AND FIRMWARE UPDATES NOTICE".



Step 5: Select your country.



Step 6: Setup LCN (Logical Channel Number). Turn on LCN to get the channel number automatically from the program.



Step 7: Time Setting



Step 8: Read the End User License Agreement.



Step 9: Select whether or not to connect your TV to the network.



Step 10: Select a TV source and start auto tuning



Step 11: Finish the initial setup.

- 3) If you want to restart initial settings after the first time, please select <**HOME/MENU** → Settings → Setup → Restore Default>. Please note that "Restore Default" will clear all user settings.

Electronic Program Guide (EPG)

Electronic Program Guide (EPG) is supplied by the program providers and offers information about the programs to be broadcast. You can access it in DTV mode by pressing **GUIDE** button on the remote control.

Press **GREEN** button to setup an reminding appointment to watch a coming program.

■ Schedule List

List of reminding appointments.

■ Previous/Next

Press > button to watch the program list of next day.

Main Menu Settings

- Step 1: Press MENU button, or click "Settings" on Home Page to enter Main Menu Settings.
- Step 2: Press ▲/▼ button to select the submenu:
 Picture, Sound, Channel, Time, Setup,
 Advanced or Network.
- **Step 3**: Press ▶ button to enter the selected submenu.
- Step 4: Press ▲/▼ button to select an item.
- Step 5: Press OK button to enter the selected item.
- **Step 6:** Press **▲**/**▼** or **◄**/**▶** to adjust the item.
- Step 7: Press MENU button to back to the upper-level menu.
- Step 8: Press EXIT button to exit Main Menu Settings.

Picture Menu



Note: The picture is only for reference.

■ Picture Mode

Select the picture mode: Standard, Mild, User or Dynamic. It will skip to "User" mode If you adjust the value of Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness, Tint or Backlight.

Contrast

Adjust the difference between light and dark areas of the picture (0~100).

Brightness

Adjust the lightness of the picture (0~100).

Adjust the color richness of the picture (0~100).

Sharpness

Adjust the edge of the picture (0~100).

Adjust the color tint of the picture. It is only available for NTSC system (0~100).

Backlight

Adjust the backlight of the screen (0~100).

■ Color Temperature

Adjust the overall color tone of the picture. Choices are Nature, Warm, User and Cool. It will skip to "User" mode if you adjust the value of Red, Green or Blue.

■ Aspect Ratio

Select the aspect ratio. Choices are Auto, 4:3, 16:9, Movie, Just Scan and Panorama, which vary depending on the input source.

■ Noise Reduction

Turn on to reduce the noise in the picture signal. Choices are Off, Low, Middle and High.

■ MPEG Noise Reduction

Turn on to reduce the noise created while converting or compressing MPEG picture signal. Choices are Off, Low, Middle and High.


■ Dynamic Contrast

Turn on to adjust the contrast of the picture automatically depending on the input signal.

■ Film Mode

Turn on to achieve a stable and fluent play of the dynamic picture.

Sound Menu

■ Sound Mode

Select the desired sound mode. Choices are Standard, Music, Movie, Sport and User. It will skip to "User" mode if you adjust the value of 120Hz, 500Hz, 1.5KHz, 5KHz or 10KHz

■ Balance

Control the balance between left and right speakers (-10 ~ 10). It is only available after "Surround Sound" is turned off.

■ Auto Volume

Turn on to adjust the sound volume depending on the input signal.

■ Surround Sound

Turn on to help create rich and wide sound from stereo sound sources.

AD Switch

Adjust related AD settings to help the blind or visually-impaired viewers understand and enjoy the program.

■ Digital Audio Out

Select the mode of digital audio output. Choices are PCM. Auto, Transcode DD and Transcode DDP.

■ Advanced Effect DAP

Setup the advanced effect of Dolby Audio Processor.

DAP Enable

Turn on or turn off the DAP function. Only when it is turned on, the following four items can be adjusted.

DAP Mode

Select the desired DAP mode.

Surround Virtualizer

Select the effect of Surround Virtualizer.


Dialog Enhancer

Select the effect of dialog enhancer.

Auto Volume Control

Select the effect to automatically adjust the sound volume depending on the input Dolby audio signal.

Channel Menu (Only for TV mode)

■ Auto Tuning

Search for channels automatically. Before searching, please select the desired input source firstly. For DTV sources, you may need to adjust related settings (**Scan Mode**, etc.) which may vary by different countries or sources.




