





External water heater safety

• Under certain conditions, hydrogen gas may be produced in your hot water heater that has not been used for two weeks or more. Hydrogen gas can be explosive under these circumstances. To prevent the possibility of damage or injury, you should turn on all hot water faucets in your home, and let the water flow out for several minutes before connecting to your washer. This will allow any built-up hydrogen gas to escape. Since hydrogen gas is flammable, do not smoke or use an open flame or start appliance during this process.

■ About Detergent

- We recommend using highefficiency or low-sudsing detergent.
- For better performance, it is recommended to dissolve detergent in 1 L of water at 35 °C.



- The operation starts with the end of hot water filled.

- We recommend leaving the washing machine for at least 1 hour between each use.

Air Dry (90 min)

The air blown from the tub rotation removes water from clothes.

Dryable clothes: Synthetic fibre (Max. 3.0 kg)



NOTE

- Clothes may not be sufficiently dried (depends on amount and type of clothes, and the temperature).
- This function does not use a heater. Clothes may be cold and half dry.














Installation


Check the location.








■ Keep the washing machine at least 10 cm away from the wall to minimise noise.

- Ensure all packing parts are fully removed. Do not install on the bottom packing. May cause serious damage to the machine.




Make sure the drain hose is securely hooked so that it does not come off by water pressure during drainage.

- The installation shall be in accordance with the requirements of AS/NZS 3500.1.





- Do not twist, squash, modify or cut the hose.







NOTE)

- If you have an uncontrolled water heating source (e.g., wet back, solar heating), fit a tempering device (e.g., a safe valve). This will ensure the hot water temperature remains within safe limits. Contact a local plumber or plumbing supply merchant for the most suitable type of tempering device.
- Time for hot water to reach washing machine will depend on proximity of washing machine to hot water tank.






