
Preparation







Connecting the TV

Insert the mains plug firmly into place.




- When disconnecting the mains lead, be absolutely sure to disconnect the mains plug at the socket outlet first.
- Keep RF (aerial) cable away from the mains lead to avoid and minimise mains interference pickup.
- Do not place the RF cable under the TV.
- $^{\circ}$ An aerial, correct cable (75 Ω coaxial) and correct terminating plug are required to obtain optimum quality picture and sound.
- If a communal aerial system is used, you may require the correct connection cable and plug between the wall aerial socket and the TV.
- Your local Television Service Centre or dealer may be able to assist you in obtaining the correct aerial system for your particular area and the accessories required.







Initial Setup

When you first turn on the TV, a series of steps will popup to guide you to setup your TV.

Plug the mains plug into the socket outlet and turn on the TV.

It may take a few seconds before the screen is displayed.



Google - Initial Setup

When you turn on the TV for the first time, a series of prompts will guide you to setup the initial settings:

When your phone is connected to your TV, you can set up your TV on your phone (connect to Wi-Fi and enter Google account), your TV will automatically get the Wi-Fi and Google account information on your phone.

You can also use the remote to set up your TV and log in to your Google account.

Press ▼ to go to the next step.

Step 6: Select Connect your TV to a WIFI network. If you did connect your TV to internet via an Ethernet cable before the initial setup begins this step will be skipped. How to Pair Remote Control with the TV



BACK OK DIST

This is a Bluetooth remote control, and before using it, please pair it with the TV firstly. When TV is turned on for the first time, a pairing process for your remote will be performed during the initial setup. Your remote control should automatically pair with your TV at this point.

You can add an additional Voice Remote with Google to your TV, or you may also need to replace one if your old one broke. Other Bluetooth devices like speakers, games controllers can also be connected via Bluetooth.

The following steps are for your reference:

Step 1: Press f button to enter the home page.

Step 2: Press ▲/▼/◄/▶ to choose ② to enter.

You can also directly select the **()** button on the remote control.

Step 3: Press $\mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V}/\mathbb{A}/\mathbb{P}$ to choose Remotes & Accessories, and press OK to enter.

Step 4: Press ▲/▼/◀/▶ to choose Pair accessory and press OK to enter.

NOTE: Under this menu, you can choose turn Bluetooth on or off, Add a new Remote & Accessories or set up a remote control or accessory that's already connected to your TV.

Follow the on screen instructions to pair it. (Press hold ← and f for 5 seconds on the "new" remote. Your remote control should be paired with your TV at this point, it will appear in the list. And then press OK on your remote to confirm adding this new remote).

NOTE: If you experience difficulties in pairing your remote with your TV you can turn off other wireless devices and try again.

If you want to unpair the Bluetooth remote, follow these steps:

Step 1: Press n button to enter the home page.

Step 2: Press ▲/▼/◄/▶ to choose ② to enter.

You can also directly select the **()** button on the remote control.

Step 3: Press ▲/▼/◄/▶ to choose the remotes or accessories you need to remove and press OK to confirm.



General Operation

Using Homepage

The main screen is the centre of your TV. Press the Home button on your remote to display the main screen. From the main screen you can start any application, switch to a TV channel, watch a movie or switch to a connected device, or manage the settings. Depending on your TV setup and your country selection in the initial setup the main screen may contain different items.

You can scroll through the options and content of your Home screen using the directional buttons. When the cursor stays on the icon, it displays the information of the highlighted content. Available options and content may differ depending on the network connection status of your TV and whether you signed in to your Google account.

You can select all the features from homepage. (First of all, make sure you are logged in to your Google account.)

Press n to display homepage.

Press $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$ to select icons from the screen list.

Press OK to enter each option.

Press \leftarrow or \uparrow to exit the APP.



- 1. : You can add or switch user accounts.
- 2. Home: Select icons from the screen list.
- 3. Apps: Show the list of favorite applications, or access the application center.
- 4. Library: Find your purchases, rentals, and watch listed content across TV mobile, and web here.
- 5. a: Search movies shows, apps and more.
- 6. Q: You can select Settings, Screensaver, Inputs, Picture, Wi-Fi and more.

your favorite list.

Open Favorites: Open your favorites list. **Audio Language:** Select the audio language.

Channel options: Set channel function options, select to Hide Channels, Parental controls, Audio Language, Timeshift config, Select recording storage device, Signal

Condition, Open source licenses and Version.

Virtual Keyboard:Turn the virtual keyboard on, press BACK key to close.

Press \implies then press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select your desired source, and then press OK to confirm.

The Settings menu allows you to configure the TV with your preferences.





Screen

Red, blue, green or black spots on the screen.

Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as points of red, green, blue or black. This does not affect the performance of your TV and it is not a quality problem.

Chaotic image, noisy.






